KISCA Music Event: NUE Nā ‘Ukulele ‘Ekolu

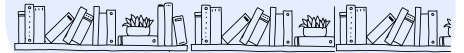


Plumeria Beach House | April 17th | 6:30PM – 8:30 PM

Native oysters filter up to 50 gallons of water per day! Removing harmful pollutants, sediment, bacteria, heavy metals, oil, microplastics, sunscreen chemicals and nutrients from the ocean.
